Now You Know




The word "yoke" appears in the New American Bible Revised Edition (NABre) 74 times in 68 verses. The *Catholic Bible Dictionary* by Scott Hahn defines yoke as "A heavy wooden beam laid across the shoulders and fastened around the neck of a team of animals, usually oxen, and tied by rope or straps. The yoke enabled the team to pull a plow or a cart. Yokes were also used on slaves and

prisoners. Metaphorically, the yoke was used both positively and negatively as a symbol of servitude."

Fr. Mitch Pacwa, in his book *How to Listen When God is Speaking*, describes how the wooden yokes of ancient times were fashioned by carpenters to exactly fit the intended beasts or persons so that they would be comfortable, thus allowing the wearer to work with efficiency. Usually, the yoke joined two animals to work in tandem. He continues with the story that St. Justin Martyr once saw a wooden yoke that had been fashioned by Jesus when He was working with Joseph; Justin was said to have admired its fine craftsmanship and remarked that the Savior certainly knew a lot about yokes.

Jesus said, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light" (Matthew 11:28-30). Jesus was offering release from the burdensome laws of the Pharisees along with the promise of salvation — one only needed to be yoked to Him, to be alongside of Him.

Since Jesus was the Master Carpenter, we can be assured that His Yoke would be designed just for us and that it would fit us perfectly to allow us to be His servants
