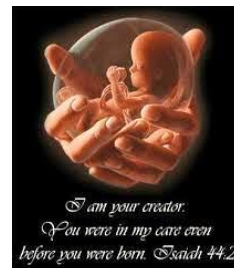

*On January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court legalized abortion throughout the United States in its companion decisions *Roe v. Wade* and *Doe v. Bolton*. Since that time, millions of children have lost their lives and millions of women and families have been wounded by abortion. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the “**Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children.**”



“Lord Jesus Christ, You took our human nature upon Yourself. You shared our life and death, our childhood and adulthood. You also shared our time in the womb. While still God, while worshiped and adored by the angels, while Almighty and filling every part of the universe, You dwelt for nine months in the womb of Mary. You were our Redeemer in the womb, our God who was a preborn child. Lord Jesus, we ask You to bless and protect the children who today are in their mothers' womb. Save them from the danger of abortion. Give their mothers the grace to sacrifice themselves, in body and soul, for their children. Help all people to recognize in the preborn child a brother, a sister, saved by You, our Redeemer in the womb.”

Scripture Study Notes

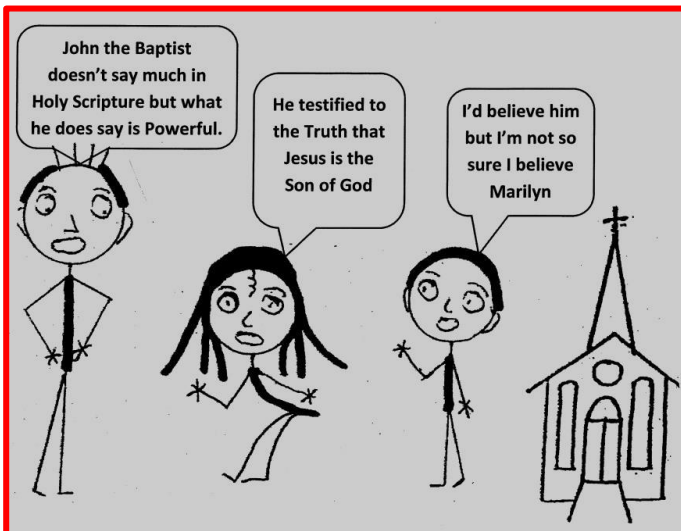


Today's first reading comes from the book of the Prophet Isaiah. The Lord called Isaiah to the prophetic office of the temple in Jerusalem in about 742 BC saying "*Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights*" (Isaiah 42:1). Then, in chapter 49, Isaiah sings his second servant song to tell how God gave him his name (mission and purpose) while he was still in the womb: "Before birth the LORD called me, from my mother's womb he gave me my name (Isaiah 49:1).

Recall that Isaiah, who lived and preached in the Southern Kingdom of Judah, would have seen the destruction of the Northern Kingdom by the Assyrians in about 721 BC and, at the end of the 8th century, saw the siege of Jerusalem by Sennacherib of Assyria.

His duty was to console the Jews with the promise of a savior to come as well as to call them to repentance for their sin of turning away from the Lord. In the fifty years of his prophetic ministry, Isaiah foretold the birth of Jesus and laid out for the Jews a path to righteousness that would be a testimony even to the Gentiles. Indeed, our patron Saint Jerome called Isaiah an evangelist saying, "*He was more of an Evangelist than a Prophet, because he described all of the Mysteries of the Church of Christ so vividly that you would assume he was not prophesying about the future, but rather was composing a history of past events.*"

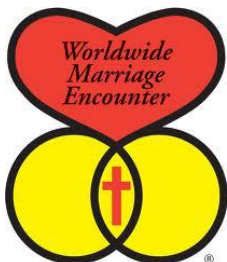
A dubious legend suggests that the evil king Manasseh had Isaiah sawed in half in about 700 BC. The words of Isaiah are quoted 99 times in the New Testament and implicitly inferred another 400 times. This prophet is, indeed, one to whom we should pay close attention.
