Now You Know



When activists took God out of schools, what did they expect to happen? Did they anticipate higher murder rates, greater drug addiction, school shootings. Without a strong moral guide – like, say, the Ten Commandments – how are our children supposed to know how to behave?



We have all heard, or perhaps personally experienced extreme examples of the downright hostility toward Christianity but some are egregious. Jerry Newcombe, D.Min., an on-air host/senior producer for D. James Kennedy Ministries provides us with one such story:

In Santa Fe, the ACLU filed suit to halt prayers at a baccalaureate service, privately sponsored by a group of ministers in 1995. The federal judge, Samuel Kent, said that the ministers could still hold the voluntary service, but that no one could pray in the name of any specific deity, such as the name of Jesus. Just to make sure they got the message, Kent declared, “Anybody who violates these orders, no kidding, is **going to wish that he or she had died as a child** [emphasis added] when this court gets through with it.”

Furthermore, the judge ruled that anyone invoking the name of Jesus at this voluntary religious service would be immediately arrested by federal marshals and jailed for a minimum of six months.

Our schools have replaced God with metal detectors but there aren't enough machines to go around. So it's little wonder that we have the mixed up, hate-filled, dangerous society we have today. Christian Internet writers have thoroughly explored what the lack of moral teaching has yielded and it is scary.

If you went to public school before 1963 or to Catholic School, count yourself blessed. Hopefully, as parents, grandparents, or godparents, we can impart those values to our children and to everyone around us. We can make “our little corner of the world” a little brighter. On the weekend of February 2nd and 3rd, we will have a second collection for the Catholic Inner-City Schools Education Fund (CISE) – **you can help encourage many children to honor Jesus and His Commands.**

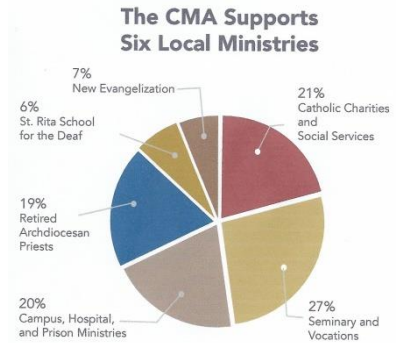
