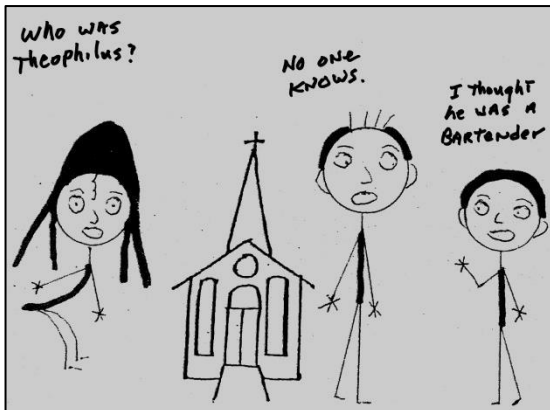
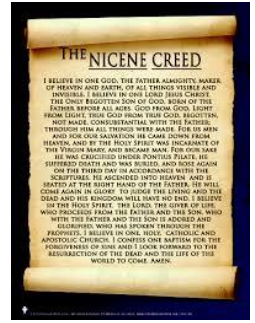

Now You Know

We say it every Sunday but do we pay attention to it? Or do we simply repeat it from rote memory without much thought? The **Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed** (325, 387 AD) is the clearest and most basic summary of our faith – All Christians are called to believe it. Even mainstream, non-Catholic churches pray it.

- “I believe in one God...” this was written when most of the world believed in multiple gods, demi-gods, or idols – it is the foundational tenet of all else.
 - “I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ...” and this one follows it closely in importance especially when we add, “born of the Father before all ages.”
 - “...by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man.” We as Catholics are obligated to believe that Mary was perpetually a virgin and that Jesus was the Son of God.
 - “...and rose again on the third day...” No teaching of Christianity would make any sense if Jesus had not been resurrected and taken up to heaven to sit at the right hand of God.
 - “I believe in the Holy Spirit...” The Trinity would not be complete without the Paraclete who was sent to us by Jesus Himself to guide us, teach us, and keep us on the right path to heaven; three persons in one God.
 - “I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.” Jesus founded one church and still today we believe that all Christians who believe in the Trinity and hold faith in this creed are members of that one church; it is apostolic because it came to us through the Apostles.
 - “I believe in one baptism...” It is baptism that wipes away Original Sin and, if we are baptized a little older, all personal sins. Alas, we can only be baptized once, so it’s a good thing we have Reconciliation.
 - “I look forward to resurrection...and the life of the world to come.” This is the whole reason that we are Christians – we seek to live with Jesus in heaven for all eternity.
- So, the next time we pray the Rosary or attend Sunday Mass, let’s think about what we say.
