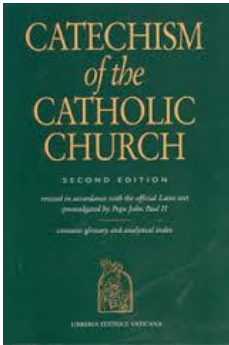

Now You Know



Have you ever been asked what you believe? If so, how did you respond?

One reason that we have memorized the Creed or Profession of Faith is precisely so that we can answer that question succinctly, directly, and unemotionally. Of course, each statement in the Creed begs more questions – that is wonderful because it leads to dialogue that might just win a convert to Jesus.

Most of us can recite the Nicene Creed from memory since we pray it at every Sunday Mass. Many of us can also recite the Apostles' Creed because we pray it with every Rosary we say. Although worded differently, the two Creeds say the same things and make the same points.

“Creed” is a word from Latin that means “believe” – therefore, a creed is a statement of belief or faith. The Creed we have come to us from the Apostles and early Church Fathers. The history of the development of the two Creeds is interesting but too lengthy to explore here.

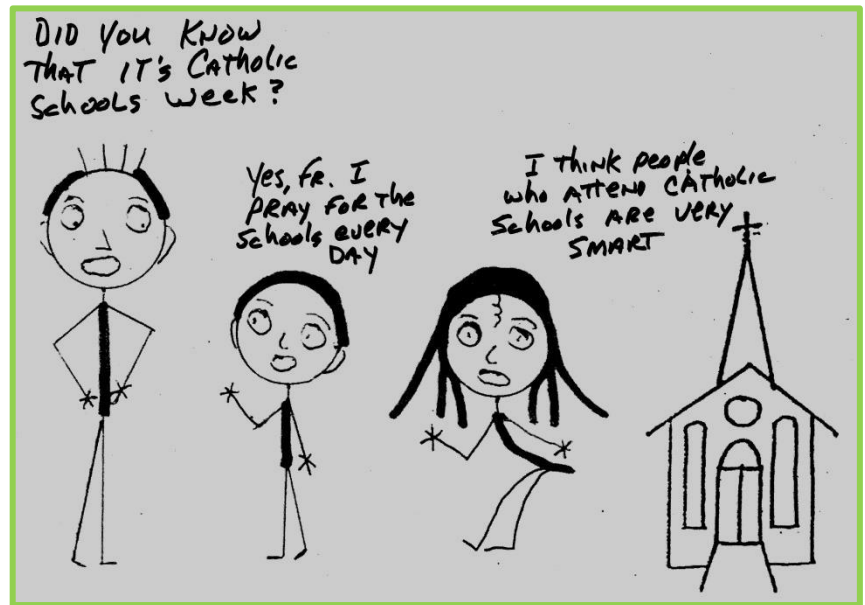
The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) takes each statement in the Creed and discusses it in great detail. For example, the explanations of the statement “I believe in God the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth...” takes 60 pages.
