

The Solemnity of All Saints is a **Holy Day of Obligation. You may fulfill your duty by attending Mass on Wednesday afternoon or on Thursday evening, or both.

Now You Know

Many people have included us in their wills and estate plans. You may be able to help us while you are still living and in doing so, might benefit yourself by lowering your tax burden. If you have an IRA or 401(k) – other than Roth – and you are over 70-1/2, you may be required to take at least a Minimum Required Distribution (MRD). Distributions from these retirement plans count as taxable income and this income increase may push you into a higher tax bracket and may impact the taxes you pay for your Social Security or Medicare.



If you'd like to reduce the effect of RMDs on your taxes, please consider making a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) directly from your account to us. A QCD excludes the amount you donate from taxable income and can be counted toward satisfying your RMD for the year, as long as certain rules are met. A tax advisor can help you determine when to take RMDs and if a QCD is appropriate for your situation. And St. Jerome Church will certainly benefit from your donations.


