Now You Know



Archbishop Samuel Aquila (Denver) wrote an article last week that puts some light on what we as lay members of the Body of Christ must do to prevent our despair in these times of Crisis that seem so dark. He writes, “‘The waters have risen and severe storms are upon us,’ St. John Chrysostom once preached. ‘But we do not fear drowning, for we stand firmly upon a rock. Let the sea rage, it cannot break the rock. Let the waves rise, they cannot sink the boat of Jesus.’ Many of us need to hear such words in these trying times, when we are torn apart by the sins committed against innocent children and teenagers, and also confronted with the temptation to despair....We must remember and live in the truth that ‘the boat of Jesus’ cannot sink, even if it appears to be in peril.

“...The Church is going through a period of intense purification, and during this difficult time, it is important for us to place our hope in the right place — in Jesus Christ and his eternal sacrifice for us....Only Jesus can heal the wounds of those sexually abused, only Jesus can bring the Church to what she is meant to be, and only Jesus can make both clergy and laity holy. In our encounter with Jesus, he desires each one of us to be healed, to be forgiven. He desires us to receive his love and mercy for us. To receive the gift of his love, mercy and healing, we must put our complete trust and confidence in him, in his power and authority as God. He desires only our good; he is our Lord and God, our Savior, our friend. May the Holy Spirit grant each of us a greater faith in these times, one that recognizes the rock on which we stand, Jesus Christ. Amen!”
