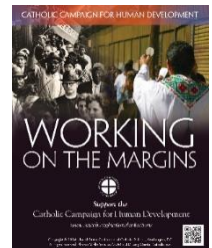

The feast is intended to proclaim in a striking and effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations. It seems more appropriate now than ever before.

Now You Know



“Hermeneutics” is the study of the methods of understanding and interpreting Holy Scripture. There are several approaches, called “methods”, of interpretation, many of which are controversial and/or archaic. Today, many Catholic scholars employ the “Historical-Critical” method which is a scientific approach to the meanings embedded in the languages used in the Bible along with the literary style in which they were written.

As an example, let’s say that 1,000 years from now an archeologist comes across a fragment of a newspaper from last week and it contains the headline, “Massacre in Cincinnati.” Now, in order for scientists to know what that was all about, they would have to know several things: Among them, the date the headline appeared, the historical events of the day, and the literal and idiomatic meanings of each word.

Further, assume that some words on the same page said something like, “Saints crush Bengals.” The scholars might look to see if Bengal tigers had become extinct about that time or perhaps they might look for other meanings. It would be helpful for them to know a little bit about American football and the slang surrounding it so they could understand that the Cincinnati sports team did not fare well.

There are, perhaps, as many as 450 English translations of the Bible, each written to clarify in modern terms what ancient writings sought to communicate. Many churches believe in “personal interpretation” of scripture, meaning that each of us can take away whatever we want from reading God’s Word – that could lead to grave error.

For us, however, we have many excellent reference books and interpretive guides plus highly educated priests and deacons who help us understand what God is telling us.

There is an old saying, "Stop telling God how big your storm is and start telling the storm how big your God is."
