“Many groups have a tendency to use words that make sense to their members but are unintelligible to outsiders. I have sometimes had to decode “Church-speak” for recent converts” (Msgr. Charles Pope).

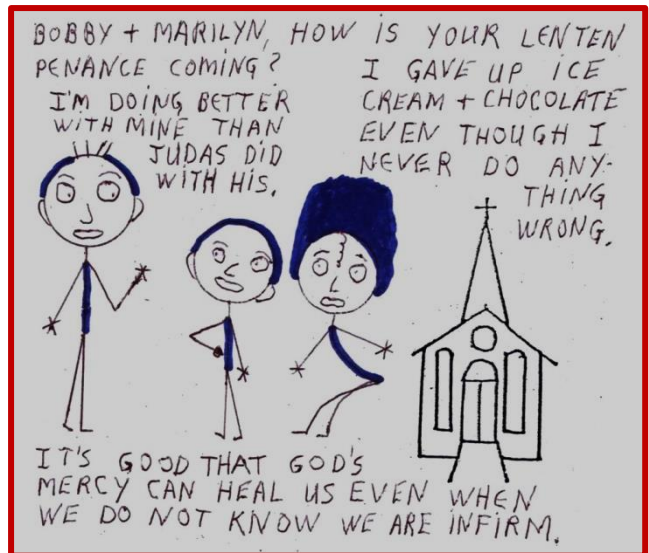
For example, do you know the definitions of these words that are commonly used among Church-speakers:

- Apologetics (the art and science of making a reasonable case for Christian beliefs)
- Apocrypha (means hidden away; Protestants use this term for the 7 books in the Catholic Bible that do not appear in theirs; Catholics use the term for the many so-called “gospels” that are not included in our Scriptures)
- Atonement (a sacrifice for the forgiveness of sins; Jesus atoned for our sins)
- Beatification (recognition by the Church that a past person is in heaven)
- Charismata (gifts freely given, usually from the Holy Spirit)
- Collect (a gathering prayer, usually the opening prayer at Mass)
- Concupiscence (a desire for something sinful)
- Exegesis (a thorough analysis of the text of Holy Scripture)
- Expiation (to make amends for some wrong; Jesus died to expiate for our sins)
- Parousia (the second coming of Christ)

Of course there are hundreds more. We’ll try to give you some more here someday. Meanwhile, please rest assured that here at St. Jerome we’ll try to use more common words when we can.
