Ron's Lenten Tomato Soup

(Great with grilled cheese sandwiches)

Time: 20 Minutes; Servings: 2

Ingredients

1 tsp olive oil
1/4 cup chopped white onion
1 can (14oz) diced tomatoes
1 cup whole milk
1 tbsp flour
1 inch basil paste*
Salt and pepper

*Herb paste tubes are near the fresh herbs in your supermarket

Instructions

Sauté onions in medium pot
Add tomatoes, bring to a boil,
and reduce to a simmer
In a separate small sauce pan
add milk and flour, stir to combine,
heat while stirring to thicken mixture,
then add to tomatoes
Add basil
Place the soup into a blender and puree
until smooth
Reheat and season to taste
Garnish with garlic croutons.



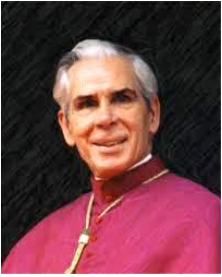
