Once again, the Church is being criticized for “not conforming to the modern world”. Even some of her own bishops are questioning the doctrine prohibiting same-sex relations. God’s laws do not change to fit the times but society must change to conform to God’s divine natural law. Holy Scripture is very clear and no bishop, not even a pope, can change the Word of God. St. Paul wrote: “*Do not be deceived; neither fornicators nor idolaters nor adulterers nor **boy prostitutes** nor **sodomites** nor thieves nor the greedy nor drunkards nor slanderers nor robbers will inherit the kingdom of God*” (1 Corinthians 6:9-10) (emphasis added). We do not condemn homosexuals but we simply ask that they live chastely, just as single people and heterosexual people who must not perform genital satisfaction outside marriage.
