



# Catechism of the Catholic Church

## What We Believe and Why We Believe It




“**I believe** in one God, the Father Almighty....” Our holy mother, the Church, holds and teaches that God, the first principle and last end of all things, can be known with certainty from the created world by the natural light of human reason. Without this capacity, man would not be able to welcome God’s revelation. Man has this capacity because he is created “in the image of God.” Genesis 1:27 - *God created mankind in his image; in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them.*

**One God.** Jesus himself affirms that God is “the one Lord” whom you must love “with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength” (Mark 12:29). At the same time Jesus gives us to understand that he himself is “the Lord.” To confess that Jesus is Lord is distinctive of Christian faith. This is not contrary to belief in the One God. Nor does believing in the Holy Spirit as “Lord and giver of life” introduce any division into the One God.

**Father Almighty.** God is the *Father* Almighty, whose fatherhood and power shed light on one another: God reveals his fatherly omnipotence by the way he takes care of our needs; by the filial adoption that he gives us (“*I will be a father to you, and you shall be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty*” 2 Corinthians 6:18.): finally by his infinite mercy, for he displays his power at its height by freely forgiving sins.

**The Academics, the Artist, and the Architect: Retrieving the Catholic Tradition** - Wednesday, April 10, 2019, 7:30 PM at The Athenaeum.

In the nineteenth century, the Catholic Church rose like a phoenix from the aftermath of the French Revolution and the Napoleonic Wars. Three complementary, but contrasting revivals: the theological, artistic, and architectural helped to reinvigorate Catholicism. The dynamism of these movements continues to inspire and can help serve to reinvigorate our own age. The Presenter will be Father Joseph Carola, S.J., Professor of Patristic Theology at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome.
