
Prayer of Spiritual Communion for Those Who Cannot Attend Mass




Anderson Township

Today's second reading is from Saint John's first letter to the Church. John, "the disciple whom Jesus loved" (John, was probably the youngest of the Apostles and the only one who did not die a martyr's death but, rather, died of old age as a hermit. The Gospel According to Saint John, the First, Second, and Third Letters of John, and the book of Revelation are generally attributed to him. In today's reading, Saint John encourages Christians to be holy:

"My children, I am writing this to you so that you may not commit sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous one. He is expiation for our sins, and not for our sins only but for those of the whole world. The way we may be sure that we know him is to keep his commandments. Those who say, "I know him," but do not keep his commandments are liars, and the truth is not in them. But whoever keeps his word, the love of God is truly perfected in him" (1 John 2:1-5).

Many people in today's modern world have become followers of Jesus because of the testimony of Saint John and the martyrdom of the other Apostles. It's hard to imagine that they would have lived and died as they did if Jesus were not truly the Son of God, the Savior.

"All creatures that exist are in the hands of God. The action of the creature can only be perceived by the senses, but faith sees in all things the action of the Creator. It believes that in Jesus Christ all things live, and that His divine operation continues to the end of time, embracing the passing moment and the smallest created atom in its hidden life and mysterious action." —Fr.
