As if you didn't know, the hostile attack on Christianity seems to worsen every day. When the Christian-owned restaurant Chick-Fil-A dared to invade the progressive sanctum of New York City, the once-relevant *New Yorker* called it an "infiltration," specifically citing the chain's, "pervasive Christian traditionalism."
