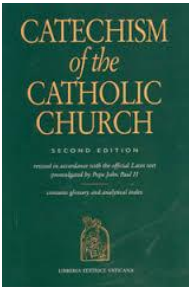

***Solemn Passiontide Vespers with the Mount St. Mary's Latin Schola**

The Mount St. Mary's Latin Schola will sing Solemn Vespers on Sunday, April 7, 2019, 7:00 PM in the Chapel of St. Gregory the Great at the Athenaeum of Ohio. This Vespers marks the beginning of Passiontide, the last two weeks of Lent leading up to the Paschal Triduum. Come sing the hymns, psalms, and canticles of Vespers and listen to a musical meditation on the Passion of Our Lord, including the chanted Reproaches and works by Lassus, Lotti, and Victoria. All are welcome and admission is free.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

What We Believe and Why We Believe It



“I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ,…” In Hebrew “Jesus” means “God saves.” At the annunciation, the angel Gabriel gave him the name Jesus as his proper name, which expresses both his identity and his mission. Since God alone can forgive sins, it is God who, in Jesus his eternal Son made man, “will save his people from their sins”.

The name “Jesus” signifies that the very name of God is present in the person of his Son, made man for the universal and definitive redemption from sins. It is the divine name that alone brings salvation, and henceforth all can invoke his name, for Jesus united himself to all men through his Incarnation, so that “there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.”

The entire body of Holy Scripture, from the story of creation in Genesis to the end of the New Testament with Revelation, points to the Messiah, the Christ (anointed one). From the Fall of Adam, we were all doomed, but, God, wishing to save us from the fires of hell, sent Jesus to redeem us by His life, death, and resurrection. In baptism (a sacrament instituted by Jesus) we were freed from Adam’s Original Sin but our sinful nature remains so, try as we might, we can never be perfect.

Jesus reaches out to all of us and invites us to receive His gift of grace and redemption. Some people will not listen and many cannot listen. It is our mission to serve as witnesses to the love of Christ so to win souls for Him.

The Athenaeum of Ohio is pleased to offer two summer courses beginning this May: "Biblical Theology of Creation" taught by

Dr. Matthew Genung, and "Preambles of Faith: The Writings of Flannery O'Connor" taught by Dr. Tracy Jamison. Classes will be held evenings from May 20th through June 20th. **"Biblical**

Theology of Creation" (Tuesday and Thursday evenings) will

study selected passages from the Pentateuch, Prophets, Wisdom, and New Testament texts, in order to examine the theme of creation in the Bible, its function within its immediate and canonical contexts, and its relation to salvation. **"Preambles of Faith"** (Monday and Wednesday evenings) will study the compositions of Flannery O'Connor, which have attracted many people to Catholicism. The course will attempt to appreciate the inherent value of O'Connor's stories as works of art and to assess their instrumental value as preambles of faith. The tuition cost for each course is \$870; for auditors, \$450; and for alumni auditors and senior citizen auditors (65+), \$250.
