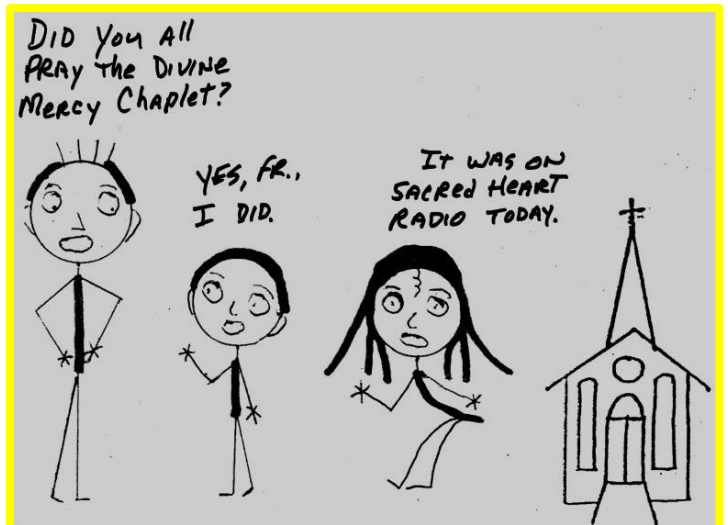
This Thursday, April 12, is Holocaust Remembrance Day, a time which should cause us to reflect not only on what happened to the Jews of Europe but also upon what is happening to Christians in hostile parts of the world. Even here in the United States, the culture is becoming more secular and our faith in God is unwelcome.

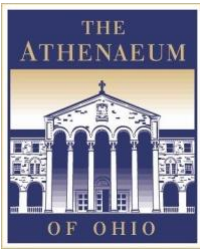
Racism and bigotry seem, too, to be resurging. If we do not remember the horrible inhumanities of the past, we might be doomed to suffer them again.

The torture and slaughter of six million Jews by the Nazis is memorialized by the Jewish day of remembrance called Yom Hoshuah. On this day, Christians and Jews alike pray for those souls who perished and should also pray for deliverance from all persecutions. The day highlights the universal dimension of the Holocaust and encourages education on this tragedy so that future generations will firmly reject all forms of racism, violence and anti-Semitism. The Holocaust was a defining point in history and its lessons have much to teach about the danger of extremism and the prevention of genocide today.
