Catechism of the Catholic Church

What We Believe and Why We Believe It

"...and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures."

Jesus Himself said, **"Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up"** (John 2:19). Although He was in Herod's temple when he said this, He was referring to His body – our bodies, like His, are temples of the soul. He later told His Apostles, **"He [the Son of Man] will be handed over to the Gentiles and he will be mocked and insulted and spat upon; and after they have scourged him they will kill him, but on the third day he will rise"** (Luke 18:32-33).

"The third day" has significance among the Jews; it usually means a short, undetermined interval and is used in literature as a reference to awaiting something good. The prophet Hosea even wrote, **"He [the Lord] will revive us after two days; on the third day he will raise us up, to live in his presence"** (Hosea 6:2). The phrase occurs 48 other times in the New American Bible Revised Edition (NABre); 34 of those occurrences are in the Old Testament.

Usually, when Bible Study leaders facilitate the study of the Gospels, they find it wise to start at the end; all four evangelists, Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, tell about Christ's Passion and Resurrection. Without the Resurrection, there would be no Church; life would be pointless. But, since we know Jesus did, indeed, rise from the dead, we all have hope in eternal life with God in heaven.
