*Pope Francis has decreed that Latin-rite Catholics around the world will mark the feast of "the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church" on the Monday after Pentecost each year. The Gospel reading for the feast, which technically is called a "memorial," is John 19:25-31, which recounts how from the cross Jesus entrusted Mary to his disciples as their mother and entrusted his disciples to Mary as her children.

The decree announcing the addition to the church calendar was released March 3 by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments. Francis approved the decree after "having attentively considered how greatly the promotion of this devotion might encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the church in the pastors, religious and faithful, as well as a growth of genuine Marian piety," the decree said.

This memorial is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation and there will not be a special Mass at St. Jerome's.

Now You Know



St. Luke tell us that Jesus said, “*But you will receive power when the holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.*” When he had said this, as they [the Apostles] were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven” (Acts 1:8 - 11). And St. Mark says, “So then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God” (Mark 16:19).

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* states, “Christ’s ascension marks the definitive entrance of Jesus’ humanity into God’s heavenly domain, whence he will come again; this humanity in the meantime hides him from the eyes of men. Jesus Christ, the head of the Church, precedes us into the Father’s glorious kingdom so that we, the members of his Body, may live in the hope of one day being with him forever. Jesus Christ, having entered the sanctuary of heaven once and for all, intercedes constantly for us as the mediator who assures us of the permanent outpouring of the Holy Spirit” (CCC 565-567).

In most dioceses of the United States, this Solemnity was transferred to the Sunday before Pentecost but in some it still occurs on the traditional Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter. If you lived in Boston, Hartford, New York, Newark, Omaha, or Philadelphia, you would know that it is a Holy Day of Obligation.

They are Deacon Craig Best (St. Margaret/St. John), Deacon Jarred Kohn (St. Mary, Philothea), Deacon Andrew Smith (St. Luke, Beaver creek), and Deacon Jacob Willig (St. Antoninus). It’s long process to become a Catholic priest. A man first needs a bachelor’s degree, then he will study 4 or 5 more years of study and will be ordained a Transitional Deacon. Archbishop Dennis M. Schnurr announced last week that Father Anthony Brausch will be installed as the thirty-sixth President of the Athenaeum and Rector of Mount St. Mary's Seminary on May 13, 2018.

Archbishop Schnurr thanked Father Benedict O'Cinnsealaigh for his seven years of leadership as President and Rector and for his eighteen years of service to the Athenaeum and Mount St. Mary's Seminary as a faculty member. Father O'Cinnsealaigh will begin his assignment as Pastor of Our Lady of Victory Parish in Delhi on July 2, 2018.

Introducing Father Brausch's appointment to succeed Father O'Cinnsealaigh, the archbishop called The Athenaeum, "one of the finest houses of formation in this country." Father Brausch, who is currently the seminary's vice rector and director of formation, will assume his new position on May 13, at the Athenaeum's graduation ceremony.
