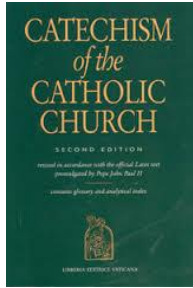


Catechism of the Catholic Church

What We Believe and Why We Believe It

“He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.”

The Apostles witnessed Christ’s ascension: ***“So then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God”*** (Mark 16:19).

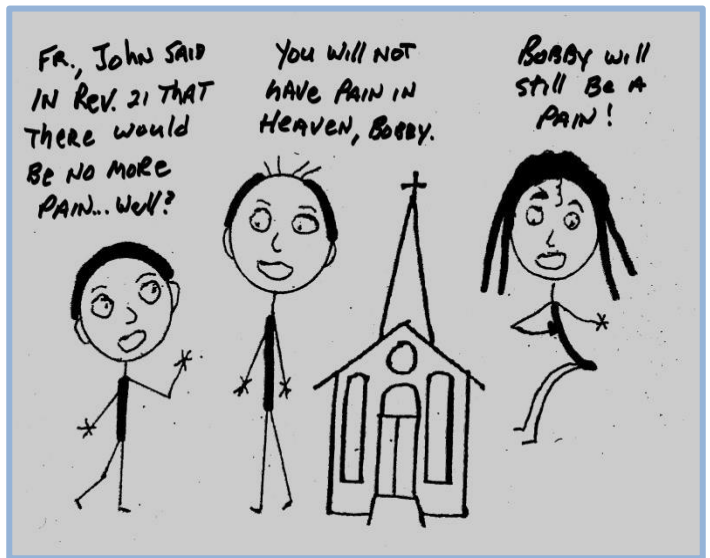


The Catechism remarks that: Henceforth Christ is *seated at the right hand of the Father*: “By ‘the Father’s right hand’ we understand the glory and honor of divinity, where he who exists as Son of God before all ages, indeed as God, of one being with the Father, is seated bodily after he became incarnate and his flesh was glorified” (CCC #663). Jesus Himself said, ***“From now on you will see ‘the Son of Man seated at the right hand of the Power’ and ‘coming on the clouds of heaven’ ”*** (Matthew 26:64).

Even the Prophet Daniel in about 180 BC knew what was going to happen: ***“I saw coming with the clouds of heaven One like a son of man. When he reached the Ancient of Days and was presented before him, He received dominion, splendor, and kingship; all nations, peoples and tongues will serve him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not pass away, his kingship, one that shall not be destroyed”*** (Daniel 7:13-14).
