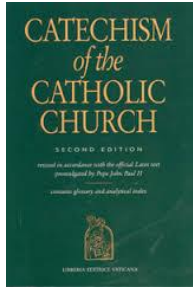

Catechism of the Catholic Church

What We Believe and Why We Believe It

“He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead....”



Jesus told His disciples, **“When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left”** (Matthew 25:31-33). He also told them that those on His right would be welcomed into heaven but those on His left would be put **“into the eternal fire prepared for the devil**

and his angels” (Matthew 25:41). So, we have it on Christ’s own authority that He would, indeed, come in glory and would judge everyone living and dead.

We know, too, from the Apostles’ Creed, that Jesus descended into hell where He preached the Gospel to the dead. St. Peter wrote that, **“...they [all people] will have to give an accounting to him who stands ready to judge the living and the dead”** (2 Peter 4:5).

Again, from Jesus Himself, we are given some of the criteria on which we will be judged: **“ ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?’ He will answer them, ‘Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.’ And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life”** (Matthew 25:44-46).



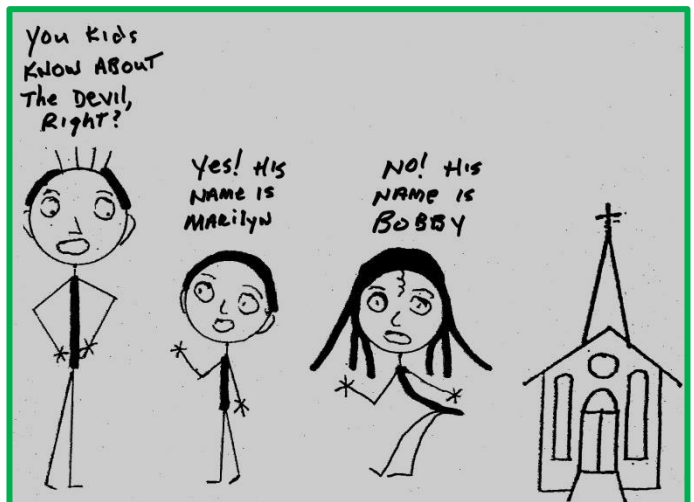

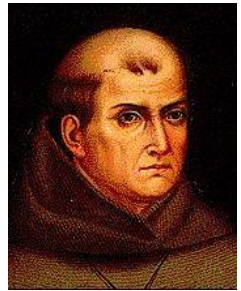
