## Now You Know



We don't know if you were following this case or not: *Masterpiece Cakeshop v. Colorado Civil Rights Commission (CRC)*. Jack Phillips refused to bake a wedding cake for a gay wedding in 2012. The couple, represented by the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), sued the bakery and the CRC was poised to fine Phillips and force him to bake cakes that he said violated his religious beliefs.

Phillips, represented by Alliance Defending Freedom, sued the CRC and lost in lower court. One of the commissioners said, "Freedom of religion has been used to justify all kinds of discrimination throughout history." He even compared the case to the Holocaust.

Phillips took the case to the Colorado Court of Appeals which again ruled against him holding that his free speech rights had not been violated and religious liberty rights were not applicable.

Last fall, the United States Supreme Court agreed to hear the case and they published their ruling on Monday, June 4. In a 7 to 2 decision, the Court sided with Mr. Phillips writing that the First Amendment guarantees that persons cannot be forced to speak. In a 59 page opinion, they wrote, "...the Commission's treatment of Phillips' case violated the State's duty under the First Amendment not to base laws or regulations on hostility to a religion or religious viewpoint."

**Catholic Charities Assists Trafficking Victims:** Each year, an estimated 17,000 vulnerable men, women and children are trafficked across our borders and then forced into slavery. Many are fleeing terrible situations in their home countries and come to the United States to find a better life. Unfortunately, the nightmare often begins when they reach our shores.

Catholic Charities is providing comprehensive case management services to foreign-born victims of trafficking through the **Trafficking Victims Assistance Program (TVAP)**. This program guides victims to “stability” by assessing their needs, coordinating services and providing financial assistance to secure safe housing, access to counseling and medical care and other basic needs.
