Now You Know



There are many Catholics, including several Cardinals, who wish that the Church would return to reception of Holy Communion on the tongue while kneeling at the communion rail. The idea began with the notion that some of us had lost the significance of the Eucharist, often seeming to ignore Christ who is truly present in the consecrated host. The advocates argue that the posture of kneeling at the rail would foster a sense of awe and respect.

Some churches have re-installed their communion rail and a few new churches are being built to include them. Church architecture has its roots in the Temple of Solomon: The large room corresponded to the church nave; the Holy of Holies, an image of heaven, corresponded to today's sanctuary. They were separated visually by the great veil, which was torn when Christ died. The rail is still a marker of the place where heaven and earth meet, indicating that they are not yet completely united.

Critics argue that the rail separates the clergy from the laity and seems to reduce participation by the congregation in the liturgy – Vatican II urged full and active participation in the Mass.

Whatever our opinions are, it is absolutely imperative that we always remember that that little piece of bread and that little sip of wine **is actually the body, blood, and divinity of Jesus Christ** and treat the Eucharist with the same reverence we would owe to Jesus in person. It is okay to receive Him in your hand – bow first then make a kind of throne with your dominant hand under the other one then use the lower hand to bring the host to your mouth. If you receive from the chalice, bow before it and sip it reverently and quietly. When we see the host we always say, “My Lord and my God” just as Thomas did when he recognized the Lord in the upper room. If you are holding a baby or a cane and only have one hand free, we recommend receiving Him on your tongue instead of snatching Him from the minister's hand.
