**Ascension is the celebration of Our Lord's rising up to heaven. It is usually celebrated on the Thursday following the 6th Sunday of Easter but in most dioceses in the United States it is transferred to the following Sunday.

"On the whole, God's love for us is a much safer subject to think about than our love for Him. Nobody can always have devout feelings: and even if we could, feelings are not what God principally cares about. Christian Love, either towards God or towards man, is an affair of the will. If we are trying to do His will we are obeying the commandment, 'Thou shalt love the Lord thy God.' He will give us feelings of love if He pleases. We cannot create them for ourselves, and we must not demand them as a right. But the great thing to remember is that, though our feelings come and go, His love for us does not. It is not wearied by our sins, or our indifference; and, therefore, it is quite relentless in its determination that we shall be cured of those sins, at whatever cost to us, at whatever cost to Him." — C. S. Lewis

Catechism of the Catholic Church

What We Believe and Why We Believe It

“I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.”

We read in Genesis, Chapter 2 v 7 about the first action of the Holy Spirit: ***“...then the Lord God formed the man out of the dust of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being.”*** This is how we know that He is the “giver of life”; the third person of the Triune God “breathed” life into Adam. (In Latin the word is “*spiraculum*” which is the root of “spirit”.)

The words “the spirit” occur 153 times in the new testament, many of them spoken by Jesus Himself. When he was speaking to His disciples about giving them His flesh, He said, ***“It is the spirit that gives life; the flesh is useless. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life”*** (John 6:63). We know that the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son because Jesus said so: ***“And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always”*** (John 14:16); and He continued to tell His Apostles, ***“The Advocate, the holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name—he will teach you everything and remind you of all that [I] told you”*** (John 14:26). (All Scriptures are quoted from the New American Bible Revised Edition [NABre].)

The Catechism, paragraph 687, says, “Now God’s Spirit, who reveals God, makes known to us Christ, his Word, his living Utterance, but the Spirit does not speak of himself. The Spirit who ‘has spoken through the prophets’ makes us hear the Father’s Word, but we do not hear the Spirit himself. We know him only in the movement by which he reveals the Word to us and disposes us to welcome him in faith. The Spirit of truth who ‘unveils’ Christ to us ‘will not speak on his own’”
