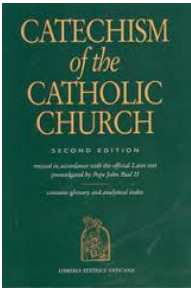

Catechism of the Catholic Church

What We Believe and Why We Believe It

"I confess one baptism for the forgiveness of sins..."

Ancient Jews practiced an annual ritual of "Ablution" or ritual washing which was supposed to purify one from their past year of sins. John the Baptist, however, took it one step further: *"He [the Baptist] went throughout [the] whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins"* (Luke 3:3 NABre).



Our Lord tied the forgiveness of sins to faith and Baptism: *"Go into all the world and preach the gospel to the whole creation. He who believes and is baptized will be saved."* Baptism is the first and chief sacrament of forgiveness of sins because it unites us with Christ, who died for our sins and rose for our justification... (Catechism 977). When we made our first profession of faith while receiving the holy Baptism that cleansed us, the forgiveness we received then was so full and complete that there remained in us absolutely nothing left to efface, neither original sin nor offenses committed by our own will, nor was there left any penalty to suffer in order to expiate them (CCC 978).

Alas, we can be baptized only once. But, when we entered into the Church through baptism, we became one with Jesus and all of His sacrificial grace. When we sin after baptism, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is freely ours to partake of and to regain the innocence we had when we were first reborn of water and the spirit.

"Confession heals, confession justifies, confession grants pardon of sin. All hope consists in confession. In confession there is a chance for mercy. Believe it firmly, do not doubt, do not hesitate, never despair of the mercy of God." — St. Isidore of Seville
