*Inspired by three decades of state and local celebrations that began in 1885, Flag Day - the anniversary of the Flag Resolution of 1777 - was officially *established* by the Proclamation of President Woodrow Wilson on May 30th, 1916. While Flag Day was celebrated in various communities for years after Wilson's proclamation, it was not until August 3rd, 1949, that President Truman signed an Act of Congress designating **June 14th** of each year as **National Flag Day**.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

What We Believe and Why We Believe It

“I believe in one holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.”

Jesus established only ONE Church: *“And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it”* (Matthew 16:18 NABre). He never said this again to anyone else – it is His Church. He renamed Simon as “Peter” which, translated, means “rock”; thus, Peter became the first pope. The word “gates” means “authorities” or “powers” or “principalities” and none of them will be more powerful than Christ’s Holy Church.

His Church is holy because it was established by the Lord Himself. “Holy” means “specially recognized as or declared sacred by religious use or authority or consecrated” – what better authority than God Himself?

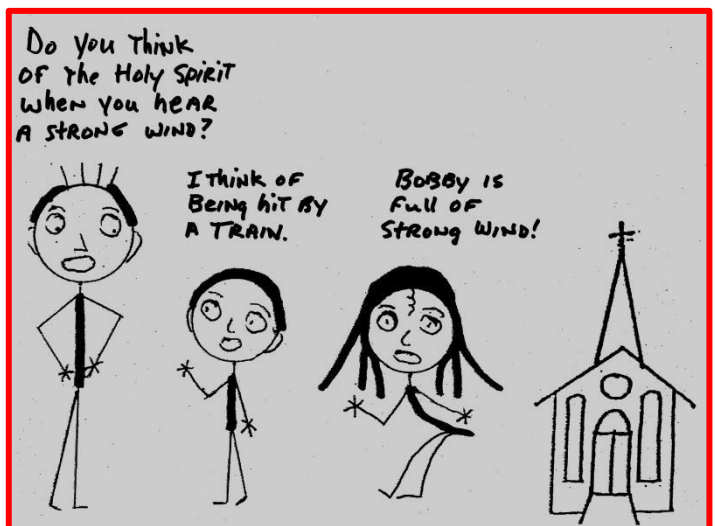
Our Church is “catholic” because it is universal, that is, for everyone in the universe. The word “catholic” (lower case “c”) is from Latin *catholicus*, from Greek *katholikos* universal, from *katholou* in general, from *kata-* according to + *holos* whole. Catholic, with a capitalized “C” became the identifier of Christ’s Church about the time of the Protestant and Anglican Reformation to distinguish it from other establishments.

It is “apostolic” because it was handed on to us by the Apostles who, after Christ’s Crucifixion, taught the Gospel, baptized believers, and spread the Word throughout much of the known world. Our Church comes to us in direct succession from Jesus Himself.
