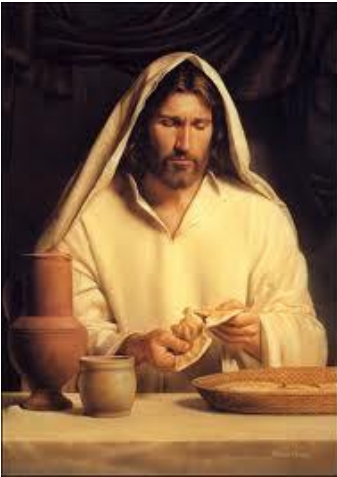

*On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity. There were few dissenting voices. What the pope solemnly declared was already a common belief in the Catholic Church. There is some controversy among scholars about whether Mary died or simply fell asleep ("domition") and was carried into the arms of the Father – some even believe that Jesus Himself came to carry her. The **Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven is a Holy Day of Obligation** – you may fulfill your duty by attending the vigil on Wednesday, the feast on Thursday, or both.

You Have Questions; We Have Answers



Is Jesus Christ truly present in the Holy Eucharist?

Jesus said, *“Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him”* (John 6:53-56). At first, that statement seems a little grisly – in fact, many Jews were repulsed by it and ran away from Him.

We are forced to ask, however, that if God Himself gave us such a commandment, would he not give us a way to truly eat His flesh and drink His blood that was a little more, say, palatable? Well, in a word, YES!

Fast forward to the Last Supper when Jesus is sharing the Passover meal with His Apostles: *“While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, ‘Take and eat; this is my body.’ Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, ‘Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins”* (Matthew 26:26-28).

That is why all our attention should be focused on the altar as the priest says the same words Christ said and the Holy Spirit changes bread and wine to Christ’s Body and Blood. And when we approach the sanctuary to receive Him – body, soul, and divinity – we are extremely reverent and awe-filled; after all, we are meeting the King of the Universe.

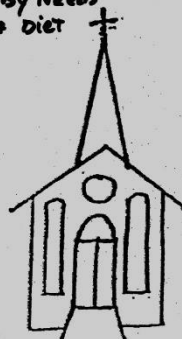

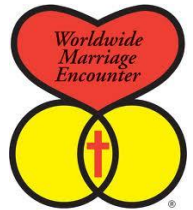
