SAINTS FUN FACTS by John Sheppard



St. Ignatius of Loyola was born in Spain. He was a soldier in the Spanish Army in wars against the French.

After the military he studied the saints and decided to be a soldier of the catholic faith. He finished his degree at age 43. Along with St. Francis Xavier and seven other students, started The Society of Jesus, or Jesuits in 1534.

He died at the age of 65

*St. Ignatius is the patron saint of the Jesuits and of teachers and educators. Before his death in 1556, he had established 35 schools and had attracted over 1,000 members to his order. His feast day is July 31.

The Society of Jesus is credited with slowing the Protestant reformation by encouraging people to use reason. Today, the Jesuits are educators and there are hundreds of schools, universities, and churches named for St. Ignatius or St. Francis Xavier.

Now You Know



The anointing of the Spirit seals the priest with an indelible, spiritual character that configures him to Christ the priest and enables him to act in the name of Christ the Head. As a co-worker of the order of bishops he is consecrated to preach the Gospel, to celebrate divine worship, especially the Eucharist from which his ministry draws its strength, and to be a shepherd of the faithful. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) says:

Through the sacrament of Holy Orders priests share in the universal dimensions of the mission that Christ entrusted to the apostles. The spiritual gift they have received in ordination prepares them, not for a limited and restricted mission, "but for the fullest, in fact the universal mission of salvation 'to the end of the earth,' prepared in spirit to preach the Gospel everywhere." (CCC 1565)

A priest, although ordained for a universal mission, exercises his ministry in a particular Church. This ministry is pursued in sacramental brotherhood with other priests who form the "presbyterate". In communion with the bishop, and depending upon him, they bear responsibility for the particular Church. Again from the Catechism:

"All priests, who are constituted in the order of priesthood by the sacrament of Order, are bound together by an intimate sacramental brotherhood, but in a special way they form one priestly body in the diocese to which they are attached under their own bishop. ..." The unity of the presbyterium finds liturgical expression in the custom of the presbyters' imposing hands, after the bishop, during the rite of ordination. (CCC 1568)

If you have never witnessed a priestly or diaconate ordination, you might consider the next ones which will take place in the spring of next year. These celebrations are beautiful and very moving.
