Now You Know

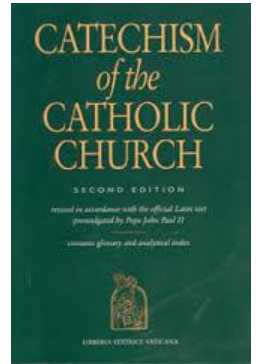
Last week, the Holy See announced a change to the Catechism of the Catholic Church – the first change since its publication in 1993. So, dig out your copy and replace paragraph 2267 with the following text:

2267. Recourse to the death penalty on the part of legitimate authority, following a fair trial, was long considered an appropriate response to the gravity of certain crimes and an acceptable, albeit extreme, means of safeguarding the common good.

Today, however, there is an increasing awareness that the dignity of the person is not lost even after the commission of very serious crimes. In addition, a new understanding has emerged of the significance of penal sanctions imposed by the state.

Lastly, more effective systems of detention have been developed, which ensure the due protection of citizens but, at the same time, do not definitively deprive the guilty of the possibility of redemption.

Consequently, the Church teaches, in the light of the Gospel, that “the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person”, and she works with determination for its abolition worldwide.



**The Knights of Columbus solicit donations from Cincinnati parishes every year to provide funds for their annual “Measure Up” Campaign to assist people with developmental disabilities. This fundraising effort raises approximately \$425,000 for statewide and local caring agencies that sponsor a variety of training and support programs. Of the money collected, 80% is returned to the local councils for donating to their local agencies. The remaining 20% is used for statewide programs.

Being Pro Life: Starting in October, a new monthly column will debut in the *Catholic Telegraph* called *Being Pro-Life*. Each month will feature an interview with someone personally affected by a different Respect Life issue, with a call to action on how to get more involved. Each column will include a link to an engaging video interview uploaded on the web, which you can view in full or listen to as a podcast. The first month will feature the story of a woman who was in a crisis pregnancy, but chose life after her experience in a local pregnancy center.

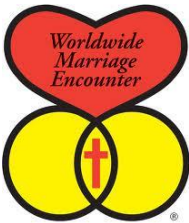
