*On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity. There were few dissenting voices. What the pope solemnly declared was already a common belief in the Catholic Church. There is some controversy among scholars about whether Mary died or simply fell asleep ("domition") and was carried into the arms of the Father – some even believe that Jesus Himself came to carry her. The **Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven is a Holy Day of Obligation** – you may fulfill your duty by attending the vigil Mass on Wednesday, the feast Mass on Thursday, or both.

You Have Questions; We Have Answers

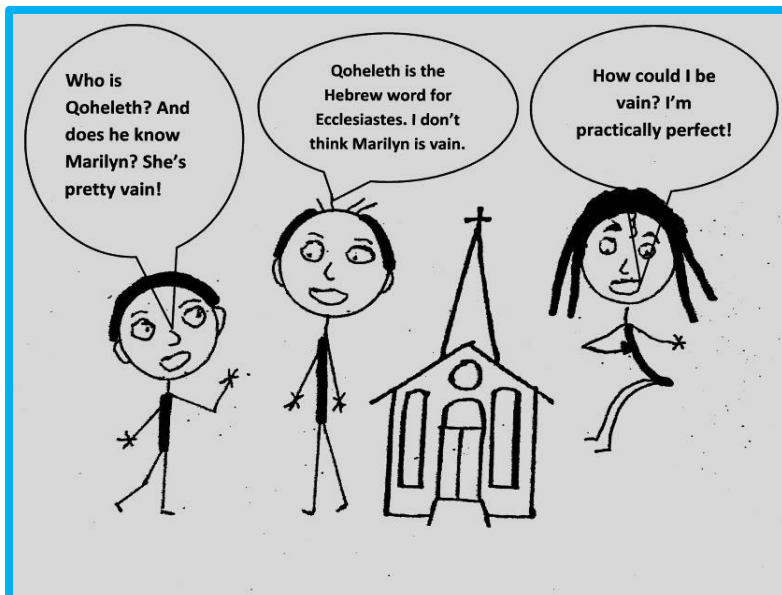


Many Protestants – especially Evangelical Fundamentalists – claim that Holy Scripture is the final and only source of authority concerning the Word of God. They call their belief “*Sola Scriptura*”, that is Latin for “by scripture alone”. However, the Catholic Church has as its sole rule of faith, the **entire** Word of God, as it is found in Sacred Scripture and **Sacred Tradition**.

All of the Word of God was at one time passed on orally...Sacred Tradition. Eventually, some of Sacred Tradition was written down...this became Sacred Scripture, which is written tradition. However, Scripture itself tells us that not all of the things that Jesus said and did were written down. St. Paul says, “So then, brethren, stand firm and hold to the **traditions** which you were taught by us, either **by word of mouth** or by letter.” (2 Thessalonians 2:15).

The Apostle St. John, said, “*Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of [his] disciples that are not written in this book*” (John 20:30). And, in another place wrote: “*It is this disciple who testifies to these things and has written them, and we know that his testimony is true. There are also many other things that Jesus did, but if these were to be described individually, I do not think the whole world would contain the books that would be written*” (John 21:24-25).

The Apostles and Disciples of Jesus lived for years after His death and Resurrection. And, the stories they told about Him would have included those which were written down and so many more that were not written down. How, we are forced to ask, can anyone not believe in Sacred Tradition that has been handed down with true authority from the beginning of the Church?



“We have to accustom ourselves to pray in all places and at all times. The real place to pray in is the soul, for God dwells there. If we wish to obey our Lord's counsel, when we pray we should enter the chamber of our soul, close the door, and speak to the Father, whose loving eyes ever seek our own. This inner chamber of our soul is the true temple, the sacred sanctuary, and we carry it with us and can at any time either remain there or quickly return to it, should we have been obliged to leave it.”
