# Now You Know



Frequently we are questioned by a Protestant asking why we confess to a priest when we could just go directly to God. Some even suggest that confession itself is silly.

Jesus Himself instituted the sacrament of Reconciliation or Penance. Only God forgives sins. Jesus told the paralytic who had been brought to him, "Child, your sins are forgiven" (Mark 2:5). Since he is the Son of God, Jesus says of himself, "The Son of man has authority on earth to forgive sins" and exercises this divine power saying, "But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority to forgive sins on earth..., I say to you, rise, pick up your mat, and go home." [The paralytic] rose,

picked up his mat at once, and went away in the sight of everyone (Mark 2:10-12).

Jesus gave that authority to the Apostles who, in turn, passed it on to priests down through the ages: "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" (John 20:21-23).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says this: "Since Christ entrusted to his apostles the ministry of reconciliation, bishops who are their successors, and priests, the bishops' collaborators, continue to exercise this ministry. Indeed bishops and priests, by virtue of the sacrament of Holy Orders, have the power to forgive all sins "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." In other words, the minister of reconciliation is standing in the person of Christ.
