## *You Have Questions; We Have Answers*



In Holy Scripture, the Apostle Saint Paul tells us that we should pray without ceasing (1 Thessalonians 5:17). And, indeed, our Church and our world need our prayers now more than ever before. Prayer helps us, too, by bringing us closer to Christ and ever more “in tune” with His Will for us.

But many of us ask ourselves where, when, and how to pray. There are hundreds, perhaps thousands of books devoted to helping us to develop the habit of prayer, some quite helpful, others may be a little too complex. In short, there are many techniques that people have adopted: *Lexio Divina* (prayerful reading of Holy Scripture); Divine Office (Liturgy of the Hours); good Catholic prayer manuals; the Mass; the Rosary; and, best of all, spontaneous prayers from our own hearts at any moment of the day. There are dozens of other prayer aids.

Some people like to reserve a special time and quiet space for daily prayer. Others like to attend daily Mass. Still others pray almost continuously, simply praising and thanking God. Often, our needs or events around us prompt us to pray for a specific grace. We know one person who, when he hears a police, fire, or ambulance siren, instantly prays for the intention of the person or persons being attended to.

We like a little book titled *Way of the Pilgrim* wherein a wandering mendicant walks through vast country sides seeking wisdom on praying incessantly. He learns to pray the “Pilgrim’s Prayer” – *O my Lord Jesus, have mercy on me a sinner* – with each beat of his heart.

However one does it, frequent prayer will help us on our pilgrimage toward heaven.

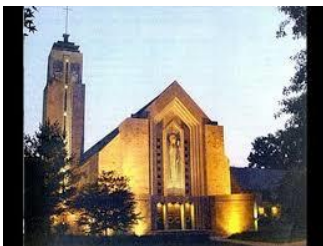
