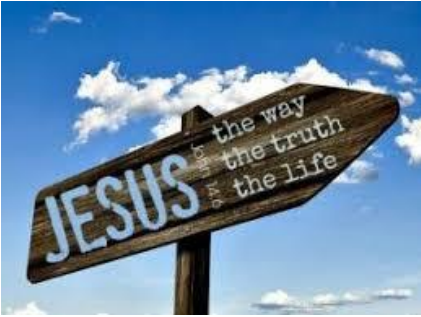

Now You Know



Pontius Pilate asked, “What is truth?” (John 18:38). Pilate asked that question in response to Jesus saying He had come to “bear witness to the truth.” People in our country, in our society, are still asking that same question today: “What is truth?”

Another infamous man, Adolf Hitler, said, “*There is no such thing as truth, either in the moral or in the scientific sense.*” If that statement is true, it refutes itself.

St. Augustine, on the other hand, wrote, “*People hate the truth for the sake of whatever it is they love more than the truth. They love truth when it shines warmly on them, and hate it when it rebukes them.*” That is what is really going on in our society today. People deny truth, they talk around truth, they try to relativize truth because they don't want to be bound by the truth. They want to live in a way that is contrary to truth, so their wills override their intellects and their consciences. That is why they are so angry. Truth is rebuking them...constantly...day and night. They have no respite from the truth. There is something deep within telling them what the truth is and that they should live according to the truth, but they don't want to accept that. So they rebel against their own nature. They are at war with themselves. And what St. Augustine said is especially true when it comes to moral and religious truth. Moral absolutes are denied and rejected. Morality is said to be purely subjective and entirely dependent upon what any given individual “feels” is right or wrong. The Ten Commandments no longer hold sway as objective moral standards, they have been replaced by one's purely subjective feelings.
