Now You Know



Our patron saint, Saint Jerome said, “*Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ.*” He also said that, “*The Scriptures are shallow enough that a babe can come to drink without fear of drowning and deep enough for theologians to swim in without ever reaching bottom.*” Some misinformed non-Catholics have accused the Church of discouraging lay people from reading the Bible but nothing could be further from the truth. St. Jerome (b. 347, d. 420) translated the Bible into popular Latin precisely so that ordinary people could read it.

Through the ages, Popes have encouraged us to read Holy Scripture. In 1893, Pope Leo XIII wrote to encourage teachers to teach Scripture to young people (Providentissimus Deus). Pope Benedict XVI wrote, “...*I express my heartfelt hope for the flowering of a new season of greater love for sacred Scripture on the part of every member of the People of God, so that their prayerful and faith-filled reading of the Bible will, with time, deepen their personal relationship with Jesus*” (Verbum Domini, 72).

It is imperative, however, that we read with the assistance of the Church Fathers and other scholars who can guide us in our understanding and interpretation of the Scriptures. There are over 20,000 various Christian churches because one after another broke away from a parent church when someone was not careful about wrongly interpreting the Word of God. Our own St. Jerome’s Adult Bible Study uses materials that are drawn from scholarly sources throughout the ages. Join us on the second and fourth Thursdays of each month at 7:30 PM in the parish hall.

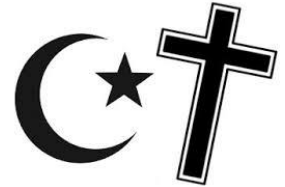
