## *You wanted to know, so we looked it up*

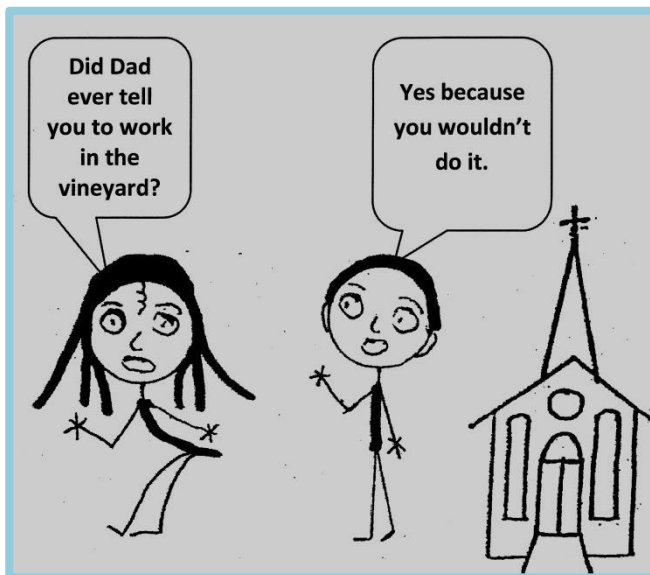


Tuesday, September 29<sup>th</sup>, is the Feast of the Archangels, Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. “Archangel” is from the Greek word meaning “chief angel”. They are members of one of the choirs, or orders, of angels. The word appears only twice in the Bible: once in 1 Thessalonians 4:16 and once in Jude 1:9. Michael, who led the angelic hosts in the struggle against Lucifer and his fellow fallen angels, is the one angel who is explicitly called an “archangel”. Two other angels named in Scripture are called archangels in Christian tradition:

Raphael, who assisted Tobias (Tobit 3:17); and Gabriel, who was sent to Daniel, Zechariah, and Mary (Daniel 8:16, 9:21; Luke 1:19–26).

Angels are purely spiritual, personal, and immortal creatures, with intelligence and free will, who glorify God without ceasing and who serve God as messengers of his saving plan. They have been present since creation and throughout the history of salvation, announcing this salvation from afar or near and serving the accomplishment of the divine plan: they closed the earthly paradise; protected Lot; saved Hagar and her child; stayed Abraham’s hand; communicated the law by their ministry; led the People of God; announced births and callings; and assisted the prophets, just to cite a few examples. Finally, the angel Gabriel announced the birth of Jesus himself.

Christians, especially Catholics, are bound to believe in angels as a truth given to us in Holy Scripture.

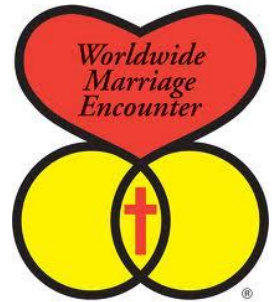
